**EXHIBIT C** contains the complete chronological record of Texas Public Information Act (TPIA) violations committed between **September 27, 2024**, and **May 12, 2025**, by municipal personnel, police officials, risk-pool representatives, and related actors who refused or obstructed lawful requests for public information. The record includes unanswered TPIA submissions, failed statutory responses, non-production of bonding/surety documentation, and deliberate administrative avoidance by required custodians of records.

**EXHIBIT C** further documents repeated failures to comply with Texas Government Code Chapter 552—specifically §552.001 (general policy of open government), §552.221 (prompt production of records), and §552.353 (criminal penalties for willful refusal).

All entries within this Exhibit are supported by USPS delivery confirmation, email evidence, written notices, sworn attestations, and documentary proof of agency silence or obstruction.

**Purpose:**

To demonstrate that municipal, county, and TMLIRP actors jointly and repeatedly violated the Texas Public Information Act by refusing to provide required public records, bonding information, authority documentation, and enforcement-related materials, thereby denying Plaintiff access to statutory mechanisms necessary to contest the seizure of his property and pursue administrative remedy. These violations form a critical component of the overall deprivation of due process and support municipal liability, supervisory liability, and joint-action liability under Civil Rights Acts of 1866, Civil Rights Acts of 1871, (42 U.S.C. § 1983).

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
