EXHIBIT G contains the complete chronological evidentiary record associated with filings, supplemental filings, notices, USPS certifications, judicial correspondence, and related materials arising from Plaintiff's **Cause No. 25-208-DCCV-27862** in the 132nd Judicial District Court, Scurry County, Texas.

The record documents the **Original May 16, 2025**, filing—tender solely to place Plaintiff's completed and perfected administrative record into the public record following the County Clerk's refusal to file the perfected *Claim of Lien/Affidavit of Obligation*—and all subsequent supplements, communications, and court responses through **December 23, 2025**.

Included within this Exhibit are:

- The **May 30, 2025** Supplement (5 pages) attached to the original filing;

- *Notarization executed establishing authenticity of the record.*

COVER SHEET

All entries are supported by documentary evidence, certified postal records, sworn attestations, and court-generated documents.

Purpose:

To show that Plaintiff tendered the record **solely to lodge a perfected administrative claim** after the County Clerk refused ministerial filing; that no justiciable issue was before the court; and that the subsequent Rule 91a dismissal issued **without subject-matter jurisdiction**. The exhibit evidences due-process violations, denial of access to courts, obstruction of ministerial duties, and joint-action liability under the Civil Rights Acts of 1866, Civil Rights Acts of 1871, (42 U.S.C. § 1983).
