EXHIBIT I contains a six-section analysis of the **Article VI Oath Clause**, demonstrating that all federal, state, and local officials are constitutionally bound to support the Constitution and are personally liable when they act under color of law to violate protected rights.

The document details the text of the Oath Clause, explains its historical purpose, links it to the enforcement mechanism of the Civil Rights Acts of 1866, Civil Rights Acts of 1871, (42 U.S.C. § 1983), and applies these principles to Defendants' conduct in the present case.

Purpose:

To establish the legal duty, created by Article VI, that each Defendant owed to Plaintiff; to show how breaches of that duty trigger liability under 14 Stat. 27 and 17 Stat. 13; and to refute any defense based on official orders, custom, or policy conflicting with constitutional supremacy.
