Description:

EXHIBIT N contains a comprehensive Judicial Notice establishing that **We the People of the United States are the sole principals in all cases at law**, and that all governmental officers, entities, and instrumentalities operate exclusively as **agents exercising delegated authority** under the Constitution. The Notice integrates constitutional text, founding enactments (1 Stat. 23; 1 Stat. 73), and controlling Supreme Court precedent to demonstrate that sovereignty resides with the People and that all public power is fiduciary in nature.

The Exhibit further applies the **law of agency**, defining the constitutional relationship as: • The People — Principal • The Constitution — Instrument of delegation • Public officials — Agents

It establishes that no officer possesses independent sovereign authority, that all power exercised is vested and limited, and that any action beyond constitutional delegation constitutes ultra vires conduct subject to personal liability.

Purpose:

To fix the controlling legal framework of principal and agent within this action; to prevent misidentification of governmental actors as sovereign authorities; to establish that all defendants acted as agents subject to constitutional limitations; and to support claims arising under 14 Stat. 27 and 17 Stat. 13 for violations committed under color of law.
