**Description:**

EXHIBIT S contains the **official Statutes at Large publication** of the Joint Resolution approved **May 3, 1940**, designated as **“I Am An American Day” (Citizenship Day)**, codified at **54 Stat. 178**.

The statutory text includes the Congressional declaration referring to the people of the United States as **“sovereign citizens of our Nation”** and establishes a national observance recognizing individuals attaining citizenship by majority or naturalization.

**Purpose:**

To establish that:

1. Congress expressly recognized Americans as **“sovereign citizens”** within a self-governing Republic;
  2. The language appears in **controlling statutory text (Statutes at Large)** and is not interpretive or editorial;
  3. The exhibit serves as the **primary evidentiary source** supporting **EXHIBIT R**;
  4. The statutory record confirms the constitutional principle that sovereignty resides in the People.
